### **Location of BRSLI**

Easy walk from station (approx. 15 mins)

Closest long-stay car park is Charlotte St. , 5 mins from Queen Square

If you are coming by car and staying overnight you may prefer to find a B&B or hotel outside the town centre and walk or bus in.

With regard to the Sunday walk, there is a café at Prior Park here should people want lunch or refreshments here.

The time is flexible – it depends how many people are coming and what time they have to leave.

Please note that the Mayor of Bath offers free walking tours of Bath every day lasting 90 mins. that leave at 10 and 2 outside the tourist office. These are good and vary every time, although the route is the same, since the volunteer guides all have their own areas of interest and expertise. However groups can be quite large at busy times.
